

Chapter 7.24

CLEANING OF OUTDOOR TOILETS, DRAINS, AND URINALS

7.24.010 Unlawful to Use Building as an Outdoor Toilet. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation or any other owner of any building used as an outdoor toilet, urinal or outdoor drains, to allow same to become unsanitary or filled, and if same shall become unsanitary or filled, it shall be the duty of said owner to cause same to be cleaned.

7.24.020 Chief of Police to Inspect Buildings. It shall be the duty of the chief of police to inspect all such buildings and whenever he deems it to be necessary to notify the owners of such premises to cause same to be cleaned.

7.24.030 Owner Guilty of Violation. Any owner who shall be guilty of a violation of any section of this ordinance, and who shall fail to cause such outdoor toilets, urinals or outdoor drains to be cleaned within 24 hours after having been notified by the chief of police to do so, shall be guilty of a separate misdemeanor for every 24 hours of such failure after receiving said notices, and shall be deemed guilty of creating, maintaining and fostering a nuisance, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in the sum of not less than \$10.00 or more than \$100.00, and all costs, for each violation.

7.24.040 Chief of Police to Cause Outdoor Toilets Cleaned. If any owner of same shall fail to have any toilet, urinal or outdoor drain cleaned within 24 hours after being notified by the chief of police to do so, it shall be the duty of the said chief of police to cause said outdoor toilet, urinal or outdoor drain to be cleaned, and he shall certify the cost of same to the county clerk and recorder, with a statement that said cost be levied and assessed and collected as taxes against the owner of said premises in the same manner as other taxes or assessments are levied, assessed and collected.
